Church Administrator 2nd Quarterly Report 2022

The Church's FY2022 Financial Records is a significant departure from all previous years. No longer are we bound by a report presenting income and expenses in gross figures, with no detail. Now, the Church can produce a financial report detailing the source of all income and the purpose for all expenses over any selected period, on demand.

Working with the Financial Secretary during the first quarter, we developed classes to track programs and funds, developed an items list to better track transactions, and created accounts to better track income and expenditures.

During this quarter, our focus was on testing and confirming the integrity of each program and fund against the income and expenses. Assisting the Financial Secretary, we created a Profit & Loss (Income & Expense) Report that details by program and account monies received from all sources (e.g., on-line, envelope donations, monies in the plate, mail-in, rentals, etc.) and the amount of monies spent and its purpose.

The new FY2022 program will enhance reporting and tracking of all the church programs (evangelism, discipleship, worship, all designated programs, and Deacon's benevolence fund). The plan is to produce the new Income & Expense Report each month and make it available to the congregation. The Report should provide visibility into the Church operations and supply answers to questions.

Building and Grounds

We have received a contractor proposal for the construction of a cement ramp, and a proposal for the installation of a modular aluminum ramp. We are awaiting proposals from a second contractor. The ramp will meet all ADA requirements and will be permitted and licensed by Citrus County. The Trustees will soon meet to select the winning proposal.

Church Appreciation in April brought a large turnout of members that joined in several teams to mow the lawn, trim bushes, and weed. Additionally, a team spread wood chips around the plants in the front of the Church and pine needles on the South side, between the Sanctuary and the Franklin building. After their hard work, they gathered to enjoy drinks and donuts.

During Church Appreciation Day in May, a small, dedicated team of volunteers mowed around the Church and weeded around all the parking areas. Most important, one volunteer, the Pastor, mounted a ladder and re-attached the roof trimming on the front of the Church.

Two dedicated Church member went beyond Church Appreciation. One member painted the front and North side entrance doors. Another Church member has been assisting Stacy with cleaning up and building storage for tools and equipment.

Currently, any work required for the Church buildings and grounds has been accomplished during Church Appreciation Day or on an Ad Hoc basis. The Church is in desperate need of members for the Building & Grounds Team. We are looking for three devoted members to join the Building & Grounds Team with Team Leader, Stacy Ash. This Team would help plan, organize, and direct the efforts of member volunteers in the repair and maintenance of our Church facilities and campus. The church, at 34-years old, is starting to show signs of wear and tear. We all want the First Baptist Church of Beverly Hills to shine bright and provide a welcome invitation for all coming to the worship services and other church activities.
